Couplet Explanation:

Unfinished tasks and undestroyed foes are akin to Unquenched remnants of a fire

Finish an enemy as you'd a fire - fully

Great minds do think alike. The wise have often reflected upon the fundamental veracities of human nature, relationships and life experiences in the same fashion. Not only did their ideas confluence, even the metaphors they used were similar.

An example could be how Vyasa, the legendary author of the Mahabharata; Chanakya, the polymath strategist and teacher from third century BCE; Valluvar, whose works date back to the first century CE; and Robert Greene, present-day American author, of the famous book '48 Laws of Power', have all written about the dangers of leaving one's enemy unfinished.

A half-finished, enemy, according to them is like a fire not thoroughly doused, as detrimental as a blazing inferno. Such an enemy can lead to unresolved conflicts and further animosity. A story from the Mahabharata discusses a moral dilemma: Should the enemy be destroyed entirely or be forgiven?

Once, when the Pandavas were in exile, they went in search of food, leaving Draupadi alone at the ashram. Jayadratha, the king of Sindhu and husband of Dushala, the only sister of the hundred Kaurava brothers, passed by and saw Draupadi. Awestruck by her beauty, he forgot that she was his sister-in-law and abducted her. In retaliation, Arjuna and Bhima massacred all of Jayadratha's men. Jayadratha fled for his life but was caught and brought to Yudhisthira by Arjuna and Bhima, who wanted to kill him. However, Yudhisthira restrained his brothers, considering Jayadratha was their cousin Dushala's husband. Draupadi was of a different opinion. She said, "An enemy who abducts one's wife though there is no cause for enmity, or steals the kingdom should not be allowed to live. Letting go of an enemy is like leaving a small portion of fire not extinguished." But Yudhisthira persisted and, finally, she agreed to forgive Jayadratha. That turned out to be a terrible decision, as Jayadratha later played a crucial role in the murder of Abhimanyu in the battle of Kurukshetra.

Chanakya has no such ambiguities. In the Arthasasthra, he says, "A debt should be paid off to the last penny; fire should be put out to the last spark; enemy should be destroyed without a trace".

Robert Greene declares it as Law No 15, 'Sometimes we learn the hard way that if one ember is left alight, no matter how dimly it smoulders, a fire will eventually break out. So, neutralise your enemies completely. Or the enemy will re- cover and come back, even stronger'.

Greene shares an example of what happened in China during the 1930s. Chiang Kai-shek had almost decimated Mao Zedong's soldiers, when he turned his attention to the invading Japanese. But in ten years, Mao Zedong's men recovered, came back and routed Chiang's army, forcing him to flee to Tai- wan. Valluvar emphasises the same rule in his poignant style, saying that leaving a task or a conflict half-done is identical to extinguishing only part of a fire. Both can lead to unforeseen consequences, potential re-ignition and increased risk.

One cannot but wonder how all these men were strikingly similar in their ideas, and at the enduring nature of certain universal truths.



Time in history -Ancient Nalanda University



Nalanda is an ancient center of higher learning in Bihar, India from 427 to 1197. Nalanda was established in the 5th century AD in Bihar, India. Founded in 427 in northeastern India, not far from what is today the southern border of Nepal, it survived until 1197. It was devoted to Buddhist studies, but it also trained students in fine arts, medicine, mathematics, astronomy, politics and the art of war. The center had eight separate compounds, 10 temples, meditation halls, classrooms, lakes and parks. It had a nine-story library where monks meticulously copied books and documents so that individual scholars could have their own collections. It had dormitories for students, perhaps a first for an educational institution, housing 10,000 students in the university's heyday and providing accommodations for 2,000 professors. Nalanda University attracted pupils and scholars from Korea, Japan, China, Tibet, Indonesia, Persia and Turkey. A half hour bus ride from Rajgir is Nalanda, the site of the world's first University. Although the site was a pilgrimage destination from the 1st Century A.D., it has a link with the Buddha as he often came here and two of his chief disciples, Sariputra and Moggallana, came from this area. The large stupa is known as Sariputra's Stupa, marking the spot not only where his relics are entombed, but where he was supposedly born. The site has a number of small monasteries where the monks lived and studied and

many of them were rebuilt over the centuries. In that one of the cells belonged to Naropa, who was instrumental in bringing Buddism to Tibet, along with such Nalanda luminaries as Shantirakshita and Padmasambhava. A small opening in the cell revealed a tiny room where Naropa supposedly meditated. Nalanda's main importance comes from its Buddhist roots as a center of learning. Hsuan Tsang, the famous pilgrim from China came here and studied and taught for 5 years in the 7th Century A.D. Nalanda University at that time had over 10,000 students and 3,000 teachers. For some 700 years, between the 5th and 12th Centuries, Nalanda was the center of scholarship and Buddhist studies in the ancient world. A great fire wiped out the library of over 9 million manuscripts and at the beginning of the 12th Century, the Muslim invader Bakhtiyar Khalji sacked the university. It was in the 1860's that the great archeologist Alexander Cunningham identified the site as the Nalanda University and in 1915-1916 the Archeological Survey of India began excavations of the site. What has been excavated to date is only a small part of the entire site but much of the ruins are beneath existing villages and are unlikely to be revealed. Across the street is the small museum with some excellent Buddhist statues and about a kilometer away is a temple dedicated to Hsuan Tsang. Nearby are the International Centre for Buddhist Studies and the Nava Nalanda Mahivihara, set up for the research of Buddhism.




The Library:

The exact number of volumes in the Nalanda library is not known, but it is estimated to have been in the hundreds of thousands. When a scholar at Nalanda died, his manuscripts were added to the library collection. The library not only collected religious manuscripts but also had texts on such subjects as grammar, logic, literature, astrology, astronomy, and medicine. The Nalanda library must have had a classification scheme which was possibly based on a text classification scheme developed by the Sanskrit linguist Panini Buddhist texts were most likely divided into three classes based on the Tripitaka's three main divisions: the Vinaya, Sutra, and the Abhidhamma.

Curriculum:

In his biography of Xuanzang, Hwui-Li states that all the students of Nalanda studied the Great Vehicle (Mahayana) as well as the works of the eighteen Nikaya traditions of Buddhism. In addition to these, they studied other subjects such as the Vedas,



Hetuvidyā (Logic), Shabdavidya (Grammar and Philology), Chikitsavidya (Medicine), the works on magic (the Atharvaveda), and Samkhya. According to Frazier, the Vedic studies included Vedic texts and ritual, but also the different theoretical disciplines associated with the limbs or the sciences of the Vedas, which included disciplines such as linguistics, law, astronomy and reasoning.

Xuanzang himself studied a number of these subjects at Nalanda under Shilabhadra and others. Besides theology and philosophy, frequent debates and discussions necessitated competence in Logic. A student at the Mahavihara had to be well-versed in the systems of Logic associated with all the different schools of thought of the time as he was expected to defend Buddhist systems against the others. Other subjects believed to have been taught at Nalanda include law, astronomy, and city-planning.

Interesting facts about Nalanda University:

- Nalanda University was established in the 5th century CE and attracted scholars from all across the world due to its renowned excellence in various disciplines.
- The library of Nalanda University, "Dharma Gunj" or "Mountain of Truth," had over nine million books, including some of the most sacred manuscripts, stored in a nine-storey building, Ratnodadhi.
- It was the world's first residential university accommodating over 10,000 students and over 2000 teachers.
- It was also a major centre for Buddhist studies and subjects like astronomy, medicine, logic, and mathematics.
- Located in the Nalanda ruins, it was declared a Unesco World Heritage Site in 2016 emphasising the site's immense cultural and historical importance.
- The idea to revive Nalanda University was proposed by former president APJ Abdul Kalam in 2006.
- The new campus signifies the revival of the world's oldest universities, blending ancient wisdom with contemporary knowledge.
- Mathematician and inventor of zero, Aryabhatt, is also believed to have studied and taught in Nalanda.
- It attracted students from all across the world, including Korea, Japan, China, Mongolia, Sri Lanka, Tibet and Southeast Asia.
